Dining Services

Husson University Dining Services welcomes you to the Dickerman Dining Center, where you will find culinary professionals committed to providing you with a quality dining experience. We serve a wide variety of foods designed to meet the needs of a diverse university community. In addition to board plans for resident students, dining dollars and commuter meal plans are available and may be purchased in the Dining Services office located in the Dickerman Dining Center.

The Eagle Grab and Go is located just inside the entrance of the Dickerman Dining Center. Serving pizza, subs, salads, cold drinks, and a variety of snacks. The Eagle Grab and Go is open late at night for students who would like a snack or meal later in the evening.

Cressy's Marketplace is located next to the Campus Center on the lower level of Peabody Hall. They provide breakfast, hot and cold sandwiches, burgers, and salads. They also offer a variety of cold beverages, packaged snacks, and other food options.

Willey's Café is located next to the Furman Student Center and serves locally roasted coffee from Wild Life Coffee Company. Their coffee and espresso drinks are very popular, along with our house-made Panini sandwiches. Check out our selection of pastries for that perfect sweet treat.

Harold Alford Hall Kiosk is located at the ground level of Harold Alford Hall. The kiosk offers a variety of coffee beverages made with locally roasted coffee from Wild Life Coffee Company. They also serve cold-brewed iced tea and coffee, as well as hot and iced lattes, chai tea, hot cocoa, and assorted pastries.

Athletics and Recreation

The Athletic and Recreation facilities include the Newman Athletic Complex, which has basketball and volleyball courts, a 25-yard, six-lane competitive swimming pool, a strength-training room, and a dance studio. The Swan Fitness Center has cardiovascular machines, weight machines, free weights, televisions, and a sound system. The Husson outdoor athletic and recreation facilities include the Winkin Sports Complex with the Harold Alford Diamond, the Boucher Soccer Pitch, the O'Keefe Softball Field, tennis courts, and practice fields.

The University offers an extensive intramural, recreational, and intercollegiate sports program for both men and women. The men and women's intercollegiate programs conform to and hold memberships in the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Division III (NCAA), Commonwealth Coast Conference (CCC), Northeast Women's Golf Conference (NWGC), Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC), and the North Atlantic Conference (NAC). Men's intercollegiate competition includes soccer, football, basketball, baseball, lacrosse, cross country and golf, indoor and outdoor track. Women's competitions include volleyball, soccer, basketball, softball, swimming, lacrosse, field hockey, cross-

country, indoor track and outdoor track, and tennis. Coed competitions include cheer, dance, and esports.

Intramural sports play a large part in satisfying the recreational needs of the University community. Many students compete in basketball, swimming, volleyball, tennis, softball, soccer, floor hockey, and flag football, to name a few. Husson campus facilities also provide many opportunities for informal recreation, like the new W.T. Gardner & Sons Recreation area.

Bookstore

Husson University's Bookstore is operated by Barnes & Noble Education.

This partnership enables us to offer the Eagle Book Bundle (EBB), an equitable access program that allows all full-time undergraduate students to receive all of their required textbooks for \$25 per credit hour in which they are enrolled. All full-time undergraduate students are automatically enrolled in EBB, and the charge is included on their billing ledger. Students are encouraged to conduct a cost comparison each semester to ensure they will benefit from EBB, and if not they should opt out and purchase/rent their books à la carte. Students who remain opted in must confirm their order 30 days before the start of each semester. Student Employment

The Human Resources Office serves as a bridge between students and the campus community by assisting students obtain part-time jobs in various departments on-campus. Safety and Security Services

Husson University is committed to providing our faculty, staff, students, and guests with a safe and friendly environment both on and around our campus. Our Safety & Security Department staff consists of 13 full-time and 5 part-time Security Officers providing 24/7 campus coverage. Officers patrol the campus, respond to complaints, investigate incidents, and provide an array of services, such as assisting with vehicle issues, unlocking doors, issuing Husson University photo ID cards, managing lost and found property, and providing "safe walk" escorts for students and employees on campus. We conduct drills and engage in planning, training, and emergency preparedness activities. Each year, Husson University publishes an [Annual Security Report](#) which includes public criminal and fire safety statistics for our campus. Maine is one of the safest states in our nation, and Husson University is a particularly safe environment, but because crimes can and do occasionally occur on our campus, we foster a strong working relationship with the Bangor Police Department to resolve incidents when appropriate. We truly believe that we all share a responsibility to keep our community a safe and enjoyable place to live and visit. To assist us in this collaborative safety approach, we strongly encourage all members of our community to report any concerning behavior, statement, or incident involving our Husson community.

Our Safety & Security Department manages Husson's free EagleSafe mobile app. Along with the dining menu and hours, athletic information, and campus activities, the app includes safety tools and features such as Mobile Blue Light and Social Escape. The app also allows you to anonymously report a concern, call for assistance, access emergency plans, or share your location with a trusted friend.

Husson University uses the Rave emergency notification system. In an emergency, this system will be used to notify you by email, text, social media, and the website, as well as display messages on the campus digital boards and subscriber devices. The Department collaborates with Student Life to offer CPR, personal safety, de-escalation classes, and other programs.
