B.S. ELEMENTARY EDUCATION (K-6)

In this program, students engage in school-based experiences at the elementary and middle school levels. Education courses and field experiences emphasize concepts of developmentally appropriate practices, effective grouping techniques, integrated curricular instruction, technology as a learning tool, and implementation of a balanced literacy program. Because student needs are diverse, the responsive teacher must possess strategies for differentiating instruction and for capitalizing upon student learning strengths within a regular classroom setting. Graduates should flexibly and strategically apply their knowledge in ways that motivate all students to achieve.

A collection of practical resources and ideas result from the cumulative experiences of the program. Frequent interactions with current teachers in the field are prioritized. There are continuous opportunities for both formal and informal reflection – a critical quality of the most effective teachers. Pre-service teachers practice the habit of reflecting upon their own learning process and performance, both academic and professional.
