

B.S. ANIMAL-ASSISTED THERAPY

The study of human-animal interactions is an exciting and growing field focusing on human relationships with animals, animal welfare, and the psychological and physiological benefits of the human-animal relationship. This unique online program combines the study of animal behavior, animal welfare, psychology and animal-assisted therapy, to provide students with comprehensive experience that prepares them for careers that integrate animals into mental and physical healthcare practices.

Program Outcomes:

- Describe the biological and psychological factors that influence animal behavior, cognition, and human interactions.
- Explain the physiological, psychological, and ethical considerations for optimal care and welfare of domesticated animals.
- Follow best practices for written and oral professional communication.
- Demonstrate knowledge of fundamental psychological principles underlying the care and welfare of domesticated animals.
- Analyze the physiological and mental health benefits of the human-animal bond.
- Interpret the legal, ethical, and beneficial aspects of animal-assisted therapies.
- Describe the biological and psychological factors that influence animal behavior, cognition, and human interactions.
- Evaluate psychological information using quantitative and qualitative reasoning skills.
- Apply animal-assisted therapy, wellness, and welfare standards of best practice.
