The BS in Wildlife Biology and Conservation at Husson University equips students with essential skills for careers in wildlife management and conservation. The program emphasizes experiential learning through practical applications, preparing students to address the challenges faced by wildlife and ecosystems.

As the natural world continues to face more and more challenges, there is a growing demand for trained professionals with expertise in wildlife and surrounding ecosystems. Graduates from our program can significantly impact biodiversity, safeguard endangered species, promote sustainable resource management, study the how wildlife interact with human communities.

Students in this program benefit from an engaging student and faculty community that provides access to modern research facilities for on-campus students and knowledgeable faculty. The curriculum encompasses subjects like ecology, conservation biology, and wildlife management, enriched by fieldwork and internship opportunities. This combination ensures our graduates are well-prepared for a dynamic career in wildlife conservation.

Program Outcomes

1. Apply natural history and biogeography principles to identify wild flora and fauna.
2. Interpret ecological concepts, theories, and models in wildlife biology and conservation.
3. Evaluate the social, political, and economic factors influencing wildlife biology and conservation.
4. Analyze scientific data used to make wildlife management and conservation decisions.
5. Communicate wildlife biology and conservation practices to diverse groups of interested parties.
